NOVEMBER 2016

As election day fast approaches, I am excited to report on timely and important work that our chapter has undertaken in support of WBASNY's initiative to register new voters. Thank you and congratulations to our Voter Registration Drive Co-Chairs. Nidhi Shetve and Vanessa Kaster and to all of the members who participated in this important effort. The NYWBA registered 461 citizens to vote, which means that our chapter



accounted for nearly one half of the goal of 1,000 registrations for the entire state.

Our Judiciary Committee has also been quite busy and screened more than half of the 16 judicial candidates for Supreme Court and Civil Court on the ballot in New York County. Thank you to the Co-Chairs of the Judiciary Committee, Jocelyn L. Jacobson, Amanda B. Norejko and Francesca A. Sabbatino, who have been co-chairing this Committee for the past three years and to all of the members of this committee who participated in the interviews of judicial candidates.

The NYWBA also hosted a number of informative and exciting programs this past month. On October 6, I was privileged to attend a screening at the Museum of the Moving Image of the documentary film "Equal Means Equal" that addressed how little progress has been made toward women's rights. The NYWBA was fortunate that Criminal Law Committee Co-Chairs, Fran R. Hoffinger and Diane Ferrone, brought a screening of this powerful movie to our members at an event on October 26, which (Continued on Page 2)
